MEDIA/PUBLICITY MANAGER'S REPORT

I look at that name, Physical Disability Rugby League and I wonder at the irony of it. We call it Physical Disability, yet from watching month after month and especially in the Grand Final, I realise there is more 'ability' in this Association than we could hope to imagine.

Our players may have disabilities, but as our logo clearly represents, they have wings on their souls and can do absolutely anything. Most of all, they can play the great game of Rugby League.

Each year brings new excitement and new challenges. We continue to grow and to build, develop and evolve. In 2013 we have had our first full year tournament with four full teams competing for the trophy. Last year we had a Round Robin, but this year we had a nine round tournament with accumulative competition points.

We kicked off with Round 1 on Saturday 6 April 2013 and games were played every three to four weeks. The season produced some great games and some even greater moments. Players showed an increasingly proficient grasp of the rules and of their own abilities and enthusiasm and pride continued to grow. The season then culminated with the Grand Final at Cabramatta Sports Ground between the South Sydney Rabbitohs and the Manly Sea Eagles, in which the Rabbitohs ran out winners by 16 points to 4.

During the year we have also aligned with and gained stronger support from the NRL and in doing so we have rebadged our teams as the Rabbitohs, the Sea Eagles, the Roosters and the Jets.

We had the fantastic opportunity to play at ANZ in front of some 40,000 spectators thanks to the support from South Sydney Rabbitohs and the team at Souths Cares.

Importantly, this year, we have finalised arrangements to become a National Association and are now re-badging the Association as Physical Disability Rugby League Australia, with intentions of expanding into other states and hopefully setting up a State of Origin framework.

But irrespective of how big we get, the spirit that started this great Association three years ago will not fade or be swept away. We are, after all, a family based organisation, run by the members for the members. We are joined by the love of the game and share the passion of access and equality.

Of course, none of our achievements would have been possible without the great support we get from those who selfishly help us. I would like to acknowledge a few people of special note who have given their time to help us along the way.

First of all to our sponsors; Macarthur Disability Services, Avatree, Cameo Carpet Cleaners, Milroy Hodgson Partners and Ingleburn RSL.

Also to the Men of League Foundation and Cabramatta Leagues, without whose support many of our functions and activities would not be possible. TREASURER'S REPORT

There is a full audited copy of the 2013 Financial Statements for Physical Disability Rugby League Australia Incorporated ("PDRLA") enclosed at the end of the Annual Report.

The Association has this year adopted a new reporting period to align itself with the rugby league season and the new Constitution. Therefore the amounts reported in the 2013 Financial Statements are for a 16 month period ending 31 October 2013. The amounts reported under 2012 are for the 12 months ending 30 June 2012.

In accordance with the above change in reporting periods, there are a number of Income and Expenditure items listed which have been incurred and reported twice in the 16 month period, purely because of the timing of the Income or Expenditure item.

Accumulated Funds

Total accumulated funds for PDRLA have increased by \$30,430 from last year. Total accumulated funds at the end of the financial year (31 October 2013) are as follows;

Income

Most of our income for the year is received through sponsorships and donations from our generous supporters, in addition to government and other association grants, fundraising efforts, membership fees, and merchandise sales.

Below is a summary of the significant income items in the 2013 financial year results;

Donations & Sponsorship

The Association has received numerous donations and sponsorships throughout the year, from Macarthur Disability Services (MDS), Ingleburn RSL Club, Cabramatta Rugby League Club, whilst accounting services were provided by the way of a sponsorship from Milroy Hodgson Partners.

Grants

The PDRLA Committee spend much effort preparing and applying for various grants, some of which are approved. In the 2013 financial year we were successful in receiving grants from New South Wales Rugby League and NSW Government Office of Communities.

Membership

Membership fees are used to pay for such things as training shirts, game day and gala day costs, and presentation awards. Fundraising, donations and sponsorships are critical in paying for uniform and equipment replacements for the teams and players of the Association.

Canteen

Special thank you to our dedicated volunteers who operated and managed a canteen facility during the 2013 financial year which assisted in providing additional funds to the association.

Expenditure

Below is a summary of the significant expenditure items in the 2013 financial year results;

Promotional Expenses

The Committee has a responsibility to its members to promote the Association, as well as a responsibility to its generous supporters (including valued sponsors) to promote their business. Promotional expenses are paid by the Committee for this purpose and in the 2013 financial year include payments for jersey framing for sponsors, keytags advertising the association, and tickets to charity dinners on behalf of Committee members of the association.

Equipment Purchases & Depreciation

The Committee continues to monitor the equipment requirements for both our clubs and players in regard to playing and safety issues. The Committee takes a very serious approach to the safety of its players and will continue to spend appropriate resources on achieving these goals. Whilst the Association is still in its infancy stage, it will continue to need to introduce and upgrade its equipment. Expenditure during the 2013 financial year included payment for rugby league balls and sports hooter.

Items of equipment which individually have a cost of more than \$300 are capitalised as assets and subsequently depreciated on a straight line method over their effective life. During the 2013 financial year these items included goal post wedges, membership card printer, laptop computer, and a PA system.

Uniform Costs



NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR PERIOD 1 JULY 2012 - 31 OCTOBER 2013

NOTE 1 STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards – Reduced Disclosure Requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the Associations Incorporation Act 1981. The association is a not-for-profit entity for financial reporting purposes under Australian Accounting Standards. NSWPDRLA is an association incorporated in New South Wales under the Associations Incorporation (NSW) Act 2009.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the association in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

Reporting Basis and Conventions

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

Accounting Policies

(a) Income Tax

The association is exempt from income tax under section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(b) Cash

For the purposes of the statement of cash flows, cash includes cash on hand and at call deposits with banks or financial institutions.

(c) Revenue

Revenue from the sale of goods and rendering of services is recognised upon the delivery of the goods or service to customers and members.

(d) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

The association is not registered for GST and all amounts are GST inclusive where applicable.

(e) Change in Reporting Period & Association Name

The Association has adopted a new reporting period to align with the Rugby League season. Therefore the amounts reported under 2013 are for a 16 month ending 31 October 2013. The amounts reported under 2012 are for the 12 months ending 30 June 2012

During the period the association changed it's name from New South Wales Physical Disability Rugby League Association Incorporated to Physical Disability Rugby League Australia Incorporated.

COMPILATION REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF PHYSICAL DISABILITY RUGBY LEAGUE AUSTRALIA INCORPORATED

Scope

We have compiled the accompanying special purpose financial statements of Physical Disability Rugby League Australia Incorporated, which comprise the detailed profit and loss account for the period 1 July 2012 to 31 October 2013. The specific purpose for which the special purpose financial statements have been prepared is to provide financial information to the committee of management.

The Responsibility of the Committee of Management.

The committee of management is solely responsible for the information contained in the special purpose financial statements and have determined that the basis of accounting adopted is appropriate to meet the needs of the committee of management for the purpose of complying with the association's constitution.

Our Responsibility

On the basis of the information provided by the committee of management we have compiled the accompanying special purpose financial statements in accordance with the basis of accounting and APES 315: Compilation of Financial Information.

Our procedures use accounting expertise to collect, classify and summarise the financial information, which the committee of management provided, in compiling the financial statements. Our procedures do not include verification or validation procedures. No audit or review has been performed and accordingly no assurance is expressed.
